I. GRADUATE LEARNING OUTCOMES

II. CURRICULUM STRUCTURE

- c. Students must take Institutional Curriculum courses determined by the faculty as many as 35 (thirty-five) courses with a total weight of 73 (seventy-three) credits.

- (6) PK elective courses that must be taken amount to a minimum of 6 (six) courses with a total weight of 12 (twelve) credits.
- (7) Students must take at least 2 (two) PK elective courses concerned out of 6 (six) PK elective courses.
- (8) Elective PK courses that have been passed or failed can be requested to be waived or dropped as long as they have met the minimum number of PK elective courses.

D. Prerequisite courses

- (1) For courses that have a prerequisite relationship can be taken after the prerequisite course is passed with a minimum grade of C.
- (2) Courses that have a prerequisite relationship include:
 - a. Civil Procedure Law prerequisite for Civil Court Practice;
 - b. Criminal Procedure Prerequisites for Criminal Justice Practice;
 - c. The Science and Right to Examine Laws and Regulations prerequisite for Drafting Laws and Regulations;
 - d. Law International prerequisite for Training Proficiency International Law;
 - e. Procedural Law of State Administrative Court is a prerequisite for State Administrative Court Practice;
 - f. Procedural Law of the Constitutional Court prerequisites for Constitutional Court Judicial Practice.
